The 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary is the wood anniversary. Why? No one's quite sure. Some say it dates back centuries, but actually more likely to date back to 1922 when Emily Post, the American 'etiquette' expert published her book "Etiquette."

The book identified symbolic gifts for each of eight milestone wedding anniversaries: paper, wood, tin, crystal, china, silver, gold, and diamond for the 1st, 5th, 10th, 15th, 20th, 25th 50th & 75th anniversaries. It's been accepted ever since.

The Newsletter grew from a start of 100 copies each month to a high of 550 copies in a month. There's email distribution that grew from 42 addresses to 120 to send to. Email distribution only since the 2020 April Issue. There's more A.A. message to carry!



On October 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2015 the Flint Area Unity Council (F.A.U.C.) Newsletter No. 1 was published as a one page flyer style.

The original Editor, Debbie G. was F.A.U.C. Literature Chair at that time. She had a vision of service to the Fellowship guided by the G.S.O. Guideline of the Central Office which reads; "A.A. Bulletin or Newsletter—The preparation of a publication for periodic distribution to A.A. groups is often a function of the central office."

On August 16, 2015, at the F.A.U.C. meeting, a motion was made, seconded, discussed, and passed to have the F.A.U.C. publish a monthly Newsletter. Approved were Debbie G. as Editor, and Doug G. as co-Editor.

As the F.A.U.C. is not a central office, and there is no G.S.O. Guideline for a District Committee; the consensus was to follow the aforementioned G.S.O. Guideline that did pertain to Bulletin/Newsletter. In addition, the Service Manual was cited; "Newsletters and bulletins published by area committees or intergroups/central offices may include local A.A. news, information about groups and committees, and reprinted material from A.A. literature....Local A.A. publications are permitted to reprint the Steps, Traditions, and/or the Concepts, and to quote a phrase, sentence or brief paragraph excerpted from A.A. literature" <sup>2</sup>

### PRINCIPLE OF CONCEPT IX

The principle of Concept IX is Ability. To be able to do something means one has a willingness. This willingness in A.A. also pertains to service structure.

"First let's remember that the base for our service structure rests on the dedication and ability of several thousand General Service Representatives (G.S.R.'s), several hundred area Committee Members, and nearly a hundred Delegates. These are the direct agents of the A.A. groups; these are the indispensable linkage between our Fellowship and its world service; these are the primary representatives of A.A.'s group conscience. Without their support and activity we could not operate permanently at all. "

#### **CONCEPT IX SHORT FORM**


"Good service leadership at all levels is indispensable for our future functioning and safety. Primary world service leadership, once exercised by the founders, must necessarily be assumed by the trustees."

#### CONCEPT IX LONG FORM

"Good service leaders, together with sound and appropriate methods of choosing them, are at all levels indispensable for our future functioning and safety. The primary world service leadership once exercised by the founders of A.A. must necessarily be assumed by the Trustees of the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous." <sup>2</sup>

### **CONCEPT IX EXPLAINED**

"At first blush, this might seem to be at odds with the Twelfth Tradition that reminds us to place principles before personalities. However, it recognizes the fact that A.A. members will permit themselves to be lead but they do not generally suffer being told what to do. As Bill Wilson said, it is like we are saying to our leaders, "Act for us, but don't boss us." If A.A. is to survive to be able to help more suffering alcoholics, it is imperative that we all find and support the very best General Service Representatives ("GSR's") -- after all, they are the ones who select District Committee Members ("DCM's") and who ultimately select Delegates to the Conference." <sup>3</sup>
