The members speak of them as a "thing that you do/work" but then say that it never ends. So trying to understand if I do 12 things and get better or if I have to continuously "lather, rinse, repeat" was troublesome. Thank goodness someone approached me and offered assistance. Not knowing any better I accepted his assistance and I found myself with an experienced member who not only had been sober but had the ability and willingness to share it with me. Our discussions started out very informative and it sounded like he really believed it would work for me too. That was enough to entice me to make my beginning. As we proceeded through the initial working of the steps he continuously referenced how they could help address daily living once I acquainted myself with how they were so much more than what I saw in those 12 sentences.

It reminds me of the first approach Ebby T. made to Bill W. He brought to him the ideas he gathered from the Oxford Group (found on page 263). When Bill actually "did/worked" those things it looks like the part of Bill's story on page 13. This initial change of heart and attitude was very impacting on his life.

Using these measures to start a new way of living drastically changed the path of this once hopeless drunk.

This way of life he'd been Introduced to would save the lives of millions.

FLINT AREA UNITY COUNCIL AIMS AND PURPOSES

- 1. To promote Unity among Flint Area A..A., and harmony with Al-Anon and Ala-teen groups
- 2. To exchange group ideas.

3. The G.S.R.'s and Alternates shall act as trusted servants of their groups.

- Each group shall be represented by a G.S.R. or Alternate. One vote per group shall be allowed in the determining matters of policy and action affecting the groups. (Committee persons are allowed one vote.)
- 5. To continue advancement of Twelve Step work and sponsorship.

6. To help financially any member group of this Council who needs help. A two-thirds majority vote will pass on any such loans which shall not be in excess of sixty days.

7. The Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts of A.A. shall prevail at all times.

8. No monies will be spent or sent out of the Council area without a two-thirds majority vote of the groups that have paid into the council in the last three months. If they are not present they will be contacted for a vote on the issue within one week.

9. The Council will create service committees and be financially responsible for them.

PROFANITY in A.A. meetings was addressed in the April 1944 Central Bulletin in an article titled "Group Behavior." It said in part:

"We believe that obscene or off-color stories as well as foul language are entirely out of place in our meetings which are opened and closed with a prayer. It is scarcely believable that such incidents are customary in any group and we feel sure that abuses will be corrected by the leaders of the offended and offending groups. It would be a good thing for us all to check not only ourselves, but our group's attitude. Let's apply the four absolutes." **Honesty**-

Unselfishness-Love-Purity. (From the Cleveland Central Committee of A.A., date unknown). There are several places in Dr Bob and the Good Oldtimers where reference is made to Bob's strong opinions about foul language in AA meetings. One of the best is on page 224 (bottom paragraph).

"And if he was sitting at a meeting and a man used bad language, Dr. Bob would say, 'You have a very good lead, young man, but it would be more effective if you cleaned it up a bit." (Reprinted by permission from A.A.W.S.)

Wall signs at some of our local meetings say; 'The Continuous Use Of Profanity Shows An Unwillingness To Change'. Another says; "The lack of profanity offends no one." Another says, "Profanity is not a sign of spiritual growth."

From another friend of Bill W.

"It seems to me that language at meetings is deteriorating, especially the use of the F-'word, "MF" or "SofaB"....When foul language becomes almost every other word...Houston we have a problem. ...We say in the Twelth Tradition that our foundation is spiritual; we are seeking to be better people, more respectful and caring; do such aspirations square with indiscriminate use of expletives? ...Today I have a sense of what a spiritual program sounds like. "
